


THE OFFICE OF CONSERVATORSHIP MANAGEMENT

THE BEGINNING

A group of independent professionals, the “Volunteer Task Force,” reviewed the Guardianship and Conservatorship process in Davidson County. The Volunteer Task Force compared the local process with models from other jurisdictions, identified needs and made specific recommendations for how the process could be improved upon. Based upon the recommendations of the Volunteer Task Force and former Metropolitan Mayor Karl Dean, the proposed office was created by the Metropolitan Council. The official name of the office is the “Office of Conservatorship Management,” which was decided to be the most accurate and appropriate title, based upon the recommended functions and goals proposed by the Volunteer Task Force, Mayor Dean, and the Metropolitan Council. The Office of Conservatorship Management was created as a division of the Metropolitan State Trial Courts Department.

The creation of the Metropolitan Office of Conservatorship Management was authorized by Substitute Ordinance No. BL2014-774; The Budget Ordinance of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, Tennessee for Fiscal Year 2015.

THE GOALS

Some of the paramount goals of this Office, as the needs were identified by the Volunteer Task Force, are to:

Review the care and management that a conservator provides for the health, safety, and welfare of individuals under a conservatorship;

Add an additional layer of review of the management of the assets by conservators;

Help connect conservators to available resources that promote successful conservatorships;

Educate conservators and the public in general about conservatorships in Davidson County;

Educate persons with a disability on their rights as a conservatee.

These goals are pursued through an active staff working in concert with other Metro departments, organizations and agencies, knowledgeable professionals, and organized volunteers.

Through these efforts, the Office of Conservatorship Management helps to encourage the responsible, ethical, and appropriate management and treatment of individuals under a conservatorship within Davidson County.

As the Director for the Office of Conservatorship Management (“OCM”), Amy Willoughby Bryant oversees the management of the office, staff, advisory committees, and active guardianship and conservatorship cases. She does policy and procedure changes, educates lawyers and public, develops training and attends court hearings. The blueprint for a statewide office exists within the OCM policy and procedures. She is a subject matter expert in the laws and the policies involved in conservatorships. She has successfully led the OCM office for the past seven years. She continues to make contacts and raise awareness about the need for more oversight in Tennessee.



THE DIRECTOR

Amy has had several articles published. Specifically, op-eds have been published in the Tennessean and the Tribune. She pinned an article about the need for training that was published in the National Guardianship Association newsletter. More recently the Tennessee Bar Journal featured her article, “How Can Tennessee Provide Better Oversight for Conservatorships?” in its July 2023 issue and “Report Card: How Well Does Tennessee Score on State Recommendations from the National Guardianship Network?” in its July 2025 issue. Moreover, she was a contributor to the CNN HBO Max documentary Blindsided.


Additionally, through her role at the OCM, Amy launched the first and only statewide online training for conservators in the state of Tennessee. This program has been shared with all of the judges and clerks across the state and nationally. The quizzes and videos have been viewed over 13,400 times and over 2,900 completions of the quizzes. It is very exciting that conservators statewide have been trained under this program.

Amy demonstrates her passion for her community through her service as a leader, instructor and volunteer. Amy serves as an adjunct professor at Belmont University College of Law in Elder Law. She has served as a member or leader for numerous organizations. She is currently the Board President for the Conservatorship Association of TN and Immediate Past President for the National Guardianship Association.

As President and committee chair for the Conservatorship Association of Tennessee, she is working to create more training for those caring for the elderly and people with a disability. She has worked to develop more accessibility to resources for conservators and those caring for the elderly and disabled by leading the effort to provide forms and resources in Spanish and updating the website as a one stop shop for conservators to meet their needs.


Through her role as the Public Education Chair for the Tennessee Bar Association, she is helping to lead an effort to provide Pro Bono legal services to the parents of young adults in public schools throughout Middle TN who need to gain a conservatorship for their child with a disability. In 2020, this initiative was launched statewide for parents of children with disabilities. This program benefited over 160 families in Middle TN thus far. In 2024, she received the B. Riney Green Award for these efforts.





Conservator of the Person


The OCM, through its partnership with Metro Social Services and Welfare Review Unit, shall independently investigate the care management provided by the conservator for the health, safety, and welfare of individuals for which the conservator has assumed fiduciary duties.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Conservator of the Property

The OCM, through its Financial Investigative Unit, shall independently investigate the asset management provided by the conservator for the financial health and betterment of a conservatorship estate for which the conservator has assumed fiduciary duties.


Financial Reviews by fiscal year




OCM CONSERVATORSHIP SCHOOL

The OCM Conservatorship School consists of 6 videos with corresponding quizzes.

- Defining Your Powers is an introduction to the conservator's fiduciary responsibilities and reporting requirements.

- Introduction to Duties and Reporting goes into further detail about the specific responsibilities of the conservator for both person and property.
- Introduction to Property Filings details for the conservator of property how to complete and file Inventory, Property Management Plans, Bond and Accountings.

- Understanding Respondent Rights is an overview of the rights of the person with a disability under statute and based on the NGA Bill of Rights.

INDEPENDENT CONSERVATOR PANEL

The OCM maintains a database of independent conservators willing to serve as a fiduciary when the respondent has no family, friend or loved one to appoint.

The independent conservator panel has grown from 17 lawyers, 5 non-lawyers, and 8 agencies in the first 5 years to 35 lawyers, 15 non-lawyers and 8 agencies currently.




